Our presenter this month is Phil Savage. His program is titled "Making The Ordinary Into The Extraordinary", which is the way he describes his photography in general. With this in mind, he is going to show us some of his methods of turning an ordinary and simple nature image into a wonderful work of art. In his own words Phil said "My photography is driven by my knowing that most images have been taken by literally millions of photographers, yet, how can I make them different that anyone else without compromising the overall theme of the image."

BIO

Phil has been influenced greatly by and owes a great deal of his love for art and photography to his parents, Paul and Anne Savage. His mother graduated from the Geneva Art Institute in Switzerland and obviously had a lot to do with Phil's art appreciation, especially in composition and color. His father, a recreational photographer himself, got him interested in photography at an early age. Phil went on to earn a B.A. in Fine Art Photography from Southern Illinois University in 1980, and then moved to Knoxville later that year. His photographic subject matter is diverse including sports, architecture, nature, abstracts, light painting, and night photography. Outside of photography he is an accomplished gymnastics trainer and started the Knoxville Gymnastics Training Center in 1982. Currently he is a coach and Director of Education for Premier Athletics, and is a member of both the Tennessee Gymnastics Hall of Fame and the Greater Knoxville Sports Hall of Fame. Phil lives in Knoxville with his wife Lisa and their three kids.

Time: Leave Knoxville at 7:30 am. Arrive at Burgess Falls at approx. 9:15 am

Group size is not limited. No reservations required.

Location description:

Burgess Falls is a natural area located approximately thirteen miles southwest of Cookeville. It is managed by Tennessee State Parks. Burgess Falls lies on the rugged dissected eastern edge of the Eastern Highland Rim resulting in the occurrence of sheer bluffs, narrow ridges, waterfalls, and diverse forest communities. The Falling Water River drops approximately 250 feet, providing numerous waterfalls, breathtaking scenery and overlooks. The largest of the waterfalls is 130 feet high. Another falls is 30 feet high, and a cascading section of the river tumbles down about 70 feet. We will have an abundance of opportunities for great flowing water compositions as we enjoy the scenery around these falls. Some of the early wild flowers may show also themselves for your lens.

Learning opportunities:

- * Artistic composition
- * Selecting shutter speeds for fast water
- * Optimizing the use of a polarizing filter

Lenses of all focal lengths and types will be useful. Long lenses will be useful in making compositions from isolated sections of the falls. Bring polarizing filters and a tripod. Waterproof foot gear might be useful for getting to the best shooting position for water shots. Since wildflower photography often involves low-angle shots, a plastic sheet is useful for protecting your legs from getting damp when you kneel or lie on the ground.

Walking required:

To see all the falls and cascades requires about 1.5 miles of walking on moderate trails. However, a lot can be seen with much less walking. The length of your walk will be your choice.

Driving directions:

Enter "Burgess Falls State Park" in Google Maps and click "Get Directions"

Drivers will receive maps and directions at the meeting place.

One way driving distance and time: 102 miles, 1 hour 45 minutes

Spring Wildflower Hike at Frozen Head State Park

Time: 10:00 AM Group size is unlimited. No reservations required.

Location description:

Frozen Head State Park is renowned for its variety of spring wildflowers. We can expect to find several varieties of violets and trillium, wild iris, wild geranium and many more spring ephemerals. If the weather cooperates and the temperatures are warm enough, we may see butterflies, bees, beetles, colorful millipedes and perhaps a salamander or two. Interesting fungi, mosses and lichens are a good possibility also. DeBord Falls on Panther Branch Creek is a short walk, about ¼-mile from the trailhead. Small cascades and moss-covered boulders along the stream offer nice photo opportunities. If we don't have too many distractions along the way, we might make it to the "Trillium Field" on the Panther Branch trail. Here we will see numerous Large-flowered White Trillium, Perfoliate Bellwort, Cumberland Spurge, Spotted and Yellow Mandarin, Dwarf Ginseng and many other wildflowers. The wide, gently-sloping trail can easily accommodate numerous photographers, their tripods and backpacks.

Learning opportunities:

- * Artistic composition
- * Getting adequate depth of field and a good background for a macro subject
- * Isolating the subject from the background using a long lens
- * Field identification and natural history of plants

Zoom lenses in the normal to wide angle range will probably be most useful. Long lenses and macro lenses will be useful for isolating small wildflowers or insects. Bring polarizing filters for the water scenes, and, as always, a tripod. Waterproof foot gear might be useful for getting to the best shooting position for water shots. Since wildflower photography often involves low-angle shots, a plastic sheet is useful for protecting your legs from getting damp when you knee or lay on the ground. A wildflower field guide is helpful for identifying new plants too.

Driving directions:

From Oak Ridge, take Hwy 62 (N Illinois Ave) to Oliver Springs. Just beyond downtown Oliver Springs, continue on Hwy 62 by turning right. From this point, go about 14 miles and turn right at the sign for Frozen State Park and continue on this road about 4 miles to the park visitor center. After meeting at the visitor center, we will continue on to the parking area at the end of the road.

Biographical information for Kris:

Kris Light is a new member of SANP. She has lived in Oak Ridge for the past 30 years. She and her husband, Ken, enjoy hiking in the parks and mountains of east Tennessee. Kris has taught environmental education outreach classes for the Oak Ridge National Laboratory and the American Museum of Science and Energy since 1987 and was a science specialist for the Oak Ridge Schools for 13 years until 2009.
