Our presenter this month is SANP member Harry Dunn. Harry will be presenting several short programs on Yellowstone, Grand Tetons, and Great Smoky Mountains National Parks. He spends a lot of time shooting in The Smokies and has been to Yellowstone and The Tetons multiple times in the last several years, so you can expect to see some interesting images. Harry has developed a reputation for presenting quality slideshow programs that include funny and entertaining stories about his photographic and travel adventures.

### **BIO**

Harry is an area native who lives in Farragut with his wife, Roseann. He served two tours of duty with the USAF during the Vietnam War, and is retired from The Boeing Company. However, his retirement lasted a whole two months, after which he went back to work because he needed to “buy some more toys” (i.e, camera gear).

Harry has been involved in photography since he got his first “instamatic” back in the late 60’s. He got more serious in the 80’s, when he bought his first true 35mm and soon after received his first photography awards. But he didn’t become an admitted “photography addict” until he bought his first DSLR. Now he spends almost all of his free time traveling and doing nature and wildlife photography. When he's not in Tennessee he's likely to be in some distant place like the San Juan Islands, Yosemite, Canyonlands, Arches, Olympic, Zion, or one of many other special places.

Harry was elected to the SANP Board this year. Some of his work has been printed in the Knoxville News-Sentinel and he is currently working on a book project. He will be conducting several incredible photo safari's in 2011. ## FIELD LEARNING EVENTS

### #1--SUNSET AND MOONRISE FROM CLINGMANS DOME

Great Smoky Mountains National Park

**Meeting place:** Parking area at the end of the Clingmans Dome Road

**Time:** 6:45 pm **Group size is not limited. No reservations required.**

**Location description:** The sunset skies around Clingmans Dome can be quite dramatic. Purple, blue or reddish haze may cover the peaks, enfolding the mountain tops in a many-layered blanket of soft color. Late day cumulus clouds often form luminous mountain ranges of their own with unique shapes and textures that rival the rolling ridges of the Smokies. Views from the top are unpredictable, but never boring.

On this date, while the sun will set at about 7:30pm. About 20 minutes later the moon will be rising in the east. The tower at top of Clingmans provides an excellent level platform from which to work. However, if you prefer not to make the climb to the tower, both the sunset and the moonrise can be viewed and photographed from the parking area. If you want to arrive early, you may find additional photo opportunities in late-blooming wildflowers along Clingmans Dome Road.

**Recommended equipment:** A full range of wide angle to telephoto lenses may be useful. A long telephoto lens can produce especially dramatic sunset and moonrise photos. A split neutral density filter can be used to help balance a bright sunset sky with darker mountains in the foreground. A polarizing filter may improve photos of clouds against a blue sky. A tripod will be essential.

**Walking required:** The walk from the parking area to the top is about a half mile on a steep and moderately strenuous paved trail. If you want to work from the parking area, very little walking will be required.

Temperatures at Clingmans Dome can be cool, maybe cold, so bring a warm jacket and gloves to keep you comfortable.

**Driving directions:** From Gatlinburg, take the Newfound Gap road (US Hwy 441) to Newfound Gap. Turn right onto Clingmans Dome Road, and drive to the parking area at the end of the road near the summit of Clingmans Dome.

### #2--SANP FALL WILDFLOWER HIKE

**Location description:** Haw Ridge is a "hidden gem" in the Oak Ridge/west Knoxville area. With 20 miles of hiking trails, there is something for everyone. Although it is mostly known for mountain biking, trail running and hiking, it is also a wonderful place for photography. The trails pass through mixed hardwood forests, cedar barrens, wetlands and open fields next to Melton Lake. The fall wildflowers should be at their peak with lots of goldenrod, Joe Pye Weed, asters, Ironweed and many more coloring the fields.

If there has been sufficient rainfall we could see interesting fungi. There are fascinating rock formations and fossils along some of the trails. A macro lens will bring out the fine details of the bryozoans and brachiopods. Along the lake we could see Great Blue Herons, Kingfishers, ducks and other birds. If we are really lucky, we might even see a snake and some colorful spiders (harmless ones, of course!). Sturdy shoes or hiking boots are recommended.

**Driving directions:** From Knoxville, go toward Oak Ridge, cross the bridge at Solway and turn right onto Edgemoor Road. Go about one mile and turn into the Haw Ridge Park. We will meet in the parking area at the kiosk.

**Biographical information for Kris:** Kris Light is a member of SANP, and has lived in Oak Ridge for the past 30 years. She and her husband, Ken, enjoy hiking in the parks and mountains of east Tennessee. Kris has taught environmental education outreach classes for ORNL and the American Museum of Science and Energy since 1987, and was a science specialist for the Oak Ridge Schools for 13 years until 2009. She looks forward to leading wildflower hikes so she can share her love of nature with others.
