Tim Grey is regarded as one of the top educators in digital photography and imaging, offering clear guidance on complex subjects through his writing and speaking.

Tim has written more than a dozen books on digital imaging for photographers, and has published over one hundred video training courses, has had hundreds of articles published in magazines such as *Digital Photo Pro* and *Outdoor Photographer*, among others.

For more than 15 years he has been publishing the daily <u>Ask Tim Grey</u> eNewsletter, answering questions from photographers. He also produces the related **Ask Tim Grey Podcast** along with publishing the monthly **Pixology** digital magazine and the **GreyLearning** video training library.

Tim teaches through workshops, seminars, and appearances at major events around the country and around the world.

Seeing the Passage of Time...

A photograph typically presents what happens in a brief moment in time, thousandths of a second when freezing a hummingbird's wings in flight, or perhaps a few minutes, when blurring water moving in a stream. What happens over seconds, minutes, hours, days, weeks, or even months can also be viewed by taking photos at different times and then viewing the images side by side. As photographers, we choose the time scale—from brief moments to much longer.

In isolation during the COVID pandemic, as I walk the same path almost daily, I find that I'm looking for the subtle changes that are occurring over time, some daily, some monthly, some over just a few minutes, and I'm marveling at what's happening in the intimate world around me.

Viewing the resulting images as a collection shows those changes that are not easy to see in real time. These collections bring me face to face with the slow and patient pace of nature, something we don't often manage on rushed weekend photo trips or during travels lasting only a few days or weeks.
