Bio: Frans DeRoos, January presenter

SANP's First Photo Challenge by Ron McConathy

The first SANP Photography Challenge is Saturday, Feb. 5, from 12 noon until 4 pm. Photographs can be made at any ground-level outdoor location within a mile radius from the front door of the building where you live. Equipment specifications for this Challenge include any handheld camera (including cell phones) and lens focal lengths from 24 to 60 mm (35mm equivalent focal lengths). These limitations should not only challenge photographic skill but also level the competition between photographers. Participants have until midnight, Saturday, February 12 (one week after the event) to submit up to three JPEG digital image files for judging. Why Challenges?

- •If you are wondering why SANP now has photo challenges along with the annual Salon, here are the reasons:
- •Our club survey showed that a number of members thought more competitions would be good.
- •Sometimes the best way to learn is to put ourselves in situations that require different approaches; hopefully, these challenges will do that.
- •Photo Challenges happen throughout the year—four regularly scheduled, one during each season, in nearby, easy-to-access locations. But (and that's an important "but") any member can sponsor a Challenge during any of the other months, designating the location and establishing the photographic requirements. Be creative!

- •Perhaps most important: let's have some fun! If the regular challenges don't meet your definition of fun, create and sponsor one that does!

I hope we will all be amazed at the photographs that will result from these challenges. In fact, I'm betting that we will see remarkable variety, considering all will be shot during the same time period with similar equipment in one location.

Future Challenges will be held at a designated place and time, but the first one was set up to make it easier for everyone to take part. Reminders have been scheduled to go out to our mailing list using SANP's Membership Management System; only members can enter images for judging.

Because these Photo Challenges are competitions, each challenge will have designated winners. Our hope is that we will be rewarding excellence in photography and also be providing reinforcement and encouragement along the way.

All submitted images will be posted in challengespecific galleries on our Zenfolio website, and winning images will be noted and announced at meetings and in the newsletter. Judges' scoresheets can be made available.
